**Re: CORONA VIRUS UPDATE – 15/5/20 (0155-19NLI)**

**Latest Schools update from Department for Education**

As you are all aware the latest information for parents / carers was released on the 11<sup>th</sup> May 2020.

*The guidance states,*

*“From the week commencing 1<sup>st</sup> June, we are asking:*

- all schools and childcare providers to continue to offer places to the priority groups – vulnerable children and children of critical workers – they have been supporting since the end of March.*

*This approach aims to limit numbers within schools and further education settings while ensuring that the children and young people who can benefit from attending most are able to do so.*

*We will only do this provided that the 5 key tests set by government justify the changes at the time, including that the rate of infection is decreasing and the enabling programmes set out in the roadmap are operating effectively. As a result, we are asking schools, colleges and childcare providers to plan on this basis, ahead of confirmation that these tests are met.” i.e. it is not a ‘definite’ that anything will change on this date”.*

Should the 5 key tests be satisfied, The Department for Education has expressed a desire that *Secondary schools should also prepare to begin some face to face contact with Year 10 who have key exams next year, in support of their continued remote, home learning.*

The feasibility of this being possible should the 5 key tests be satisfied, is currently being reviewed by all interested parties.

There is no anticipated return to the school site in the Academic Year 2019-20 for Years 7, 8 and 9.

There is no change at this stage to the qualifying factors for families under the critical key worker categorisation.



SWIFT Academies, along with parents / carers, Trade Unions etc. is currently digesting, reviewing and considering the implications and the next steps it will take as result of the documentation.

Therefore, we will be informing you in due course of the plan for each respective school within the Trust for the remainder of the Summer Term.

## **Year 11 Support**

This week we asked them to:

1. Keep sending work pictures in to your teachers to get nominated for SHOWCASE THURSDAY.
2. If you have social media, follow our departments and look out for #WeAreLongfield
3. Follow your school timetable and complete your work, stay in a routine
4. Read for 20 minutes a day
5. Go for a walk or a run to get some fresh air
6. Look after your loved ones, a phone call to ask how someone is will mean more than you imagine!

We will be introducing a 'Home School Superstar' reward system – look out for postcards arriving home. Children will also be participating in national 'Thank a Teacher Day' which is on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> May 2020.

Please remind your children that Miss. Prince continues to monitor all actions by pupils on Teams and they should access it using the same conduct rules as they would in a regular in-school lesson.
