Re: Return to School - Academic Year 2020-2021 (0001-20NLI)

I hope you and your family have enjoyed the summer and are looking forward to your child returning to school next week.

Government guidance is subject to amendment at all times; currently the school is all set for a return next week as per all national and regional directives. Please continue to look out for any further correspondence on this ever emerging picture. Further to my letter dated 15th July regarding the school's September opening plans, please see below further details of the arrangements we have put in place following Department for Education guidance. I can reassure you that these arrangements will only remain whilst the virus is still prevalent in the community. As soon as the government is confident that the virus has diminished sufficiently, we will review our position and consider whether it is safe to revert back to our usual school arrangements.

**School will reopen on Wednesday 2nd September for Year 7 and Year 11 only.
Years 8, 9 and 10 will return to school on Thursday 3rd September 2020.**

Bubbles

Pupils will be taught within their year group and in the correct set, but instead of moving around the whole school as before, they will remain in their bubble locations. Teaching/non-teaching staff will move around the school to ensure subject specialists are in front of the pupils and their curriculum is unhindered. All year groups will have their break and lunch times on a rotational basis to prevent cross 'bubble' contact.

Arriving at school

Pupils should not arrive to school before their allocated start time. The latest government guidance on travel to school is outlined below:

Wearing face coverings when travelling to and from school

Most children and young people aged 11 and above are now required to wear a face covering on public transport. This does not apply to children and young people who:

- * have a disability that means they cannot wear a face covering
- * would find wearing a face covering severely distressing
- * are travelling with someone who relies on lip reading to communicate

If your child needs to share a car to school with someone outside of their support bubble or household, they should:

- * share with the same people each time
- * open the windows for ventilation
- * if they are over the age of 11, wear a face covering

If your child has been wearing a face covering before arriving at school, they must understand how to remove it and how to keep it or dispose of it safely.

Wearing face coverings in school

Following updated Department for Education guidance, although it is not mandatory, face coverings may be worn on a voluntary basis by staff and pupils in general enclosed areas of school or while transitioning between classes in corridors.

The process for wearing and removing face coverings is as follows: -

Children and young people must:

- * clean their hands before and after wearing their face covering
- * place any temporary face coverings they may have been wearing in a covered bin

* place reusable face coverings in a plastic bag that they can take home with them or store the face covering in when they are not being used

School Uniform

Pupils will remain in Summer Uniform (polo shirts) until at least November 2020.

PE Lessons

Pupils are required to bring their outdoor PE kit as normal.

Pupil Equipment

For individual and very frequently used equipment, it is recommended that pupils have their own items that are not shared. Therefore, all pupils will be given a pencil case with the items they need included. Pupils will be expected to bring a bag with them and this should be large enough to carry an A4 file. Pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 should also have an appropriate reading book with them. Pupils are allowed to carry their own sanitiser and wipes if they wish to.

Medical Conditions

If your child has a condition which requires them to take regular prescribed medication, they will be able to access this via the Pastoral Office at the appropriate times. If your child has Asthma, they must carry their inhaler with them. If your child has an EpiPen they must also carry this with them at all times.

Canteen and Water Facilities

There will be a choice of hot and cold food at break and lunch time. There will be limited access to water coolers in school, therefore all pupils should bring their own full water bottles with them – this should be of a size sufficient for their needs for the day. Fizzy or energy drinks are not permitted.

Please ensure you are set up correctly on ParentMail to top-up your child's dinner money.

Attendance

All pupils are expected to return to school and the normal school attendance procedures will be in place. If your child is unwell you must telephone the office by 9.00am with a reason for absence. Parents / Carers should maintain daily contact with school for the period of absence unless advised otherwise. If there is no contact from parents / carers to advise of the reason for absence (*in line with our school attendance and safeguarding policies*), school will undertake first day calling and then may conduct a socially distanced home visit. If you have been advised that your child will be unable to attend due to shielding, self-isolating or if your child or a member of their household has a positive test, then please contact the school.

Mobile Phones

If your child wishes to bring their mobile phone into school, they must hand it in to their Head of Year at the start of the school day. Their Head of Year will be based in their year group bubble location (*listed above*).

Behaviour Expectations

Our expectations of high standards of behaviour and our school rewards and discipline policy remain in place. In order to ensure that all members of Longfield are safe and feel secure, additional measures are in place as per government guidance and for the benefit of our pupils and the wider community and as such must be adhered to.

All pupils are asked to maintain good hand hygiene and respiratory hygiene measures - following government advice of catch it, bin it, kill it.

Routines

Returning to school in September is always hard for pupils, getting used to early mornings, structure and routine can be challenging. We welcome your support in ensuring that your child develops a routine ahead of September. Pupils need to get back into their usual sleep patterns, get into the habit of packing their bags the night before, making sure they have all of their equipment and getting their uniform ready so that they are in less of a rush on the morning. We will expect pupils to be punctual on a morning rather than being delayed by a lack of organisation.

Curriculum



Over the past few months, pupils have been completing their work remotely and have missed the social interaction with their friends and teachers, as well as losing their usual structure and routine. As a school, we have put many plans in place to ensure your child has a smooth transition back into the school environment, that they are supported at all levels and are ready to learn. During the first few days in September, tutor groups and subject areas will be completing a range of activities focusing on re-establishing relationships, sharing stories, relaxation and recovery, self-care and readiness to learn. Departments will be using a variety of formative teaching and learning techniques to identify any gaps in pupils' knowledge and ensure that these are addressed.

We Are Longfield Curriculum



At Longfield Academy we have created the We Are Longfield Curriculum that personalises the components of PSHE, Relationships and Sex Education, Citizenship, Personal Development, assemblies and key dates to create one cohesive package for our pupils at Longfield Academy. Not only will this support pupils during their time with us but in adult life too.

We aspire to embrace the challenges of creating a happy and successful adult life. Pupils need knowledge that will enable them to make informed decisions about their well-being, health and relationships and to build their self-efficacy. Pupils can also put this knowledge into practice as they develop the capacity to make sound decisions when facing risks, challenges and complex contexts.

Curriculum Time and Assessment

At Longfield Academy we understand the importance of the uniqueness of the We Are Longfield curriculum, therefore the below time is given:

- KS3 pupils receive one hour a week.
- KS4 pupils receive one hour a fortnight.
- All pupils receive a further 20 minutes a day of We Are Longfield daily.

The curriculum overview highlights a spiral programme so that the pupils are introduced to topics, knowledge and skills in an age and stage appropriate way. Pupils are assessed at the end of each module to check the growth in knowledge and also the development of skills and attitudes.



We Are Longfield Daily

Every day the pupils receive We Are Longfield Daily to develop what is at the heart of their learning. We Are Longfield Daily is split up into five sections, for the five days a week:

1. Assembly
2. Standards, Attendance and Safety
3. Word of the Week and Silent Reading
4. Showcase Time and Retrieval Strategies
5. Spellings and Numeracy

Each form tutor will support the pupils to work through whatever task they have been set for the day to personally develop our pupils at Longfield to become and celebrate being lifelong learners.

Updated Curriculum from September 2020

In delivering sex education, schools are currently required to have regard to the Sex and Relationship Education Guidance, published in 2000. The current statutory provisions on sex education are contained in sections 403 and 405 of the Education Act 1996 as amended.

This guidance states that directors of secondary schools must provide sex education (including education about HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases) to all registered pupils.

It is the belief of Longfield Academy that every young person is entitled to sex and relationship education (RSE) as preparation to adult life. It is a key component to pupils' personal, social, health and citizenship education and complements the statutory Science education they receive.

Sex education delivered through National Curriculum Science lessons will cover the practical aspects of sex, for example, fertilisation, reproduction and the physical and emotional changes that take place during adolescence. RSE delivered through the We Are Longfield programme, will aim to follow government guidelines and focus on the three main elements of RSE that are; attitudes and values, personal and social skills and knowledge and understanding.

We aim to work in partnership with parents / carers when planning and delivering RSE and we would hope that no parent would feel the need to withdraw their child. However, as a parent you have the right to withdraw your child from any or all aspects of RSE other than those elements required by the National Curriculum Science order.

If you do wish to remove your child, this must be discussed with the We Are Longfield leads prior to the withdrawal. In this situation parents / carers are legally responsible for the delivery of RSE. The school is legally entitled to check that this has occurred.

We also have a confidentiality policy that deals with the procedures all staff would follow in the event of a disclosure by your child. This was written in line with government guidance. A copy of this is also available via the school website.
